

#1: Your student DEVELOPS SYMPTOMS of COVID:

- Following MDH guidelines, we recommend the following:

HAVE YOUR CHILD TESTED IMMEDIATELY.

- Quarantine or isolate your child for **10 days** from his/her first day of illness symptoms.
- Inform your student's school attendance line of the date your students COVID symptoms started. Your student will be marked quarantined for 10 days from the start of symptoms.

- If your child has a **COVID TEST AND THE RESULT IS NEGATIVE, he/she can return to school when feeling well enough.** Call the attendance line to inform of the negative test result so quarantine status can be removed.
- **Important Note:** Absences for quarantine are not medically excused unless a note is provided from your student's health care provider excusing them from school due to illness or documentation of a COVID test result is provided.

#2: Your student TESTS POSITIVE for COVID:

- Inform your student's school nurse of the date of the positive test (the date the test was taken).
- Provide the school with medical documentation of a positive or negative COVID-19 test.

#3: Your student is a **CONTACT EXPOSURE** to a **COVID-positive person or COVID-positive household member**:

- **ISD #2909 is NOT REQUIRING quarantine for contact exposures that occur outside of your household**; however, we ask you to follow the guidelines below to help keep all students and staff healthy:
 - Closely monitor your child over the next 14 days for symptoms of COVID as noted on the Recommended COVID-19 Decision Tree for People in Schools, Youth, and ChildCare Programs found at <https://www.health.state.mn.us/diseases/coronavirus/schools/exguide.pdf>
 - Follow the instructions noted in #1 if your student develops symptoms of illness.
- **ISD #2909 IS REQUIRING members of the same household who are close contacts to be quarantined for a minimum of 10 days** (Day 1 of 10 starts when the COVID-positive household member starts isolation.) **If household members are fully vaccinated and do not have symptoms, QUARANTINE IS NOT REQUIRED**; however, that will change if household contacts develop symptoms of COVID-19 or test positive.

#5: How will my student receive education instruction when absent:

- Your student will follow traditional methods to make-up coursework unless instructed otherwise by their teacher. Daily coursework is posted on Schoology. Virtual or online learning is not available.
- Parents/guardians of elementary students Grades K-6 are encouraged to work directly with their child's teacher to make arrangements. All students must complete required coursework.



What are the SYMPTOMS OF COVID:

More Common Symptoms:

If any ONE of these symptoms occur, your student could have COVID-19.
Refer to #1: What to do if your student develops symptoms of COVID-19.

- Fever 100.4 degrees F or greater
- New cough or cough that gets worse
- Difficulty/hard time breathing
- New loss of taste or smell

Less Common Symptoms:

If any TWO of these symptoms occur, your student could have COVID-19.
Refer to #1: What to do if your student develops symptoms of COVID-19.

- Sore throat
- Nausea
- Vomiting
- Diarrhea
- Chills
- Muscle pain
- Extreme fatigue/feeling very tired
- New severe/very bad headache
- New nasal congestion/stuffy or runny nose

If you are uncertain if your student has symptoms of COVID, please contact your child's health care provider for assistance.
